# SAFE with Mifepristone and Misoprostol

#### For pregnancy up to 11 weeks

(The FDA has approved this protocol in the USA. The WHO protocol is to 12 weeks)

## DAY1 Mifepristone

- 1) 1 pill of Mifepristone (200 mg) should be **SWALLOWED** with a glass of water.
- Normal eating and drinking for the rest of the day is allowed, but drugs and alcohol should be avoided.



### **WAIT 24 HOURS!**


Most people do not experience any symptoms during this time but some may feel nausea, cramping or bleeding.

# 2 DAY 2 Misoprostol

There should be someone close by throughout this day in case help is needed.

- At the same time of day that yesterday's pill was swallowed, 4 pills of MISOPROSTOL (800 mcg in total) should be placed **BETWEEN THE GUMS AND CHEEKS**, with 2 on each side.
- 2) The pills should be kept in place for 30 minutes while they dissolve. No food or liquids should be consumed during this time.
- 3) After 30 minutes whatever remains of the pills can be swallowed. Note: If more than 9 weeks pregnant, it is recommended to take an additional four (4) misoprostol, three (3) hours after the first dose (99% effective).

## What does it feel like when the abortion begins?

- It's normal to feel heavy cramping and bleeding for several hours.
- Most of the bleeding will stop by the next day, but there may be some light bleeding for up to 2 or 3 weeks.
- Ibuprofen can be taken to help with cramping as well as Paracetemol.

## What are common side effects from the pills?


After taking the four pills of Misoprostol you may experience any of the following for several hours:

Nausea • Mild Fever • Chills • Headache • Diarrhea
